

Cumberland Gap National Park Attractions

Visitor's Center — The park Visitor's Center houses a museum with interactive exhibits, book sales outlet, auditorium with 2 high definition films, and Cumberland Crafts which showcases handmade crafts from the region. The Visitor's Center is open from 8 to 5 daily.

Gap Cave Tours - Join park rangers on an exciting two-hour adventure exploring this majestic underground cathedral! Discover glistening stalagmites and flowstone cascades, or catch a glimpse of a bat. The moderately strenuous, 1.5 mile tour explores four levels of the cave via 183 steps. The tour includes a 1 mile hike along the historic Wilderness Road. For the safety of all, no children under the age of five are permitted. Appropriate hiking footwear is required. All tours meet at the Daniel Boone parking area. Tickets must be purchased at least 15 minutes in advance at the Visitor's Center. Tickets are \$8. for adults and \$4 for children ages 5 – 12

Pinnacle Overlook - Skyland Road and the Pinnacle Overlook
Leaving the visitor center, park visitors can drive the winding, four-mile-long Skyland Road up the mountain to the Pinnacle Overlook (elevation 2,440 feet) for a spectacular view into Kentucky, Virginia, and Tennessee.

Iron Furnace — Located in the town of Cumberland Gap.

Hiking Trails — Check at the Visitor's Center for trail information.
